INTRODUCTION

This year our territory is celebrating a couple of significant milestones. On 1 April, we celebrate the beginning of The Salvation Army in Aotearoa New Zealand, and later in the year, 50 years of service in Fiji. As we think of these milestones, we thank God for what has been and are hopeful for what is to come.

Heritage and legacy are some things that we think about a lot these days. What have we learnt from our past? What is worth passing on? What should remain in our history?

REFLECTION

Scripture talks about remembering our past. The Israelites were instructed to set up monuments in order to celebrate significant encounters with the Lord God Almighty. Why build monuments? As a reminder to teach the generations of the goodness of God. So not only were they called to remember, they were called to pass on the lessons that they learnt—to pass on the baton to the following generations.

Read Deuteronomy 4:9-10; 11:18-19

- → Who has passed on their stories and the stories of God to you? Give thanks to God for them now.
- → What part of your heritage do you wish to pass on to the next generation?
- → Who will you pass the baton of faith on to?
- → How will you be intentional about sharing your faith with others?

PRAYER POINTS

- → Give thanks for the mission and ministry that has occurred over 140 years in NZ.
- → For discernment to know who God wants The Salvation Army to be in the future.
- → For children all around the territory to embrace God's word and grow in their relationship with Jesus.
- → For adults to be great examples of Jesus.
